Course Sequence Worksheet

The Social Work major consists of 46 hours of required social work courses, 6 hours of social work electives, and 5 hours of upper division electives from social work, social science, psychology, or Native American Studies. This is a total of 57 hours. To graduate, 124 hours are required, and a minimum of 60 of these hours must be from a four year school. Therefore, only 64 hours of transfer credits will be counted toward the undergraduate degree.
