

ADVANCED HEALTH CARE DEGREE

When you're pursuing an advanced health care degree, the last thing on your mind should be how you're going to pay for it. The U.S. Army can help with one of the most comprehensive scholarships available in the health care field - The F. Edward Hébert Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP). Qualifying students receive full tuition at any accredited medical, dental, veterinary, psychology or optometry program, plus a generous monthly stipend of more than \$2,000 and will also pay for required books, equipment and most academic fees. Qualifying medical and dental students are also eligible to receive a \$20,000 sign-on bonus.

After graduation, you'll enter active duty in your specialty and advance in rank to captain. With every promotion, your salary will increase. Your time-in-service and cost-of-living adjustments also lead to pay increases. Additionally, you'll receive a monthly non-taxable allowance for food and housing.

OBLIGATION

Active Duty is usually one year for every year of scholarship (min. 2 yrs for Med Students and 3 yrs for Dental, Psychology, Optometry and Veterinary.)

ELIGIBILITY

students pursuing advanced degrees in medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, psychiatric nursing, optometry or psychology.

These scholarships with benefits usually range from \$300,000 - \$500,000 when combined with an ROTC undergraduate program.

The Army is the first to receive some of the latest technologies available to the medical field. Our medical professionals get the latest training and work with some of the best doctors in the world.

Nurse Summer Training Program (NSTP)

Nursing students who are also Army ROTC Cadets have an opportunity for a unique summer nursing experience. The paid, three-week Nurse Summer Training Program assigns Cadets to Army hospitals throughout the U.S. and Germany.

The program introduces you to the Army Medical Department (AMEDD) and to the roles and responsibilities of an Army Nurse Corps Officer. Under the supervision of an experienced Army Nurse Corps Officer, you will obtain hands-on experience. Your one-on-one clinical experience will allow you to hone your clinical skills, develop your problem-solving techniques and become comfortable with developing your professional skills as a member of the U.S. Army Healthcare Team.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are awarded based on a student's merit and grades, not financial need.

Army ROTC scholarships consist of:

- Two-, three-, and four-year scholarship options based on the time remaining to complete your degree
- Full-tuition scholarships
- The option for room and board in place of tuition, if you should qualify
- Additional allowances for books and fees

Depending on a Nursing Students selection as a Full-Time Army Nurse or as a Part-Time National Guard or Army Reserve Nurse, Scholarships w/benefits normally range between \$65,000 to \$115,000 for undergraduate degrees and up to \$500,000 for medical doctorate degrees.

EXPERIENCE

If you're considering an undergraduate nursing degree, enrolling in Army ROTC can enhance your leadership skills and critical-thinking abilities while providing financial support to help make your professional goals a reality. Being a Nurse in the Army provides you with opportunities not found in the civilian world. As an Army Nurse and Officer, you will have the respect of your peers and coworkers as well as opportunities to train and serve in a variety of specialties.

Army ROTC's Nurse Summer Training Program will give you the opportunity to truly fulfill the promises of your training after graduation. Coordinating and communicating patient care, you'll be in a clear position to succeed.

LIVING EXPENSES

Army ROTC scholarships also provide monthly living allowances for each school year. You can earn certain amounts depending on your level in the Army ROTC curriculum:

1st year/freshman, \$300 per month

2nd year/sophomore, \$350 per month

3rd year/junior, \$450 per month

4th year/senior, \$500 per month

This allowance is also available to all non-scholarship Cadets enrolled in the Army ROTC Advanced Course (3rd and 4th years).
