ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Admission Policy

- Admission to the Nursing Program is contingent upon acceptance into the University and meeting all of the School of Nursing (SON) requirements.
- 2. Admission to the University: Only applicants who have been officially admitted to Langston University will be considered for admission to the School of Nursing (SON).
- 3. University classification as a junior (completion of 60 semester credit hours and have satisfied freshman and sophomore requirements) with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- ACT composite score of 15 or better
- 5. A minimum of a C is required in each pre-requisite course prior to enrollment.
- 6. A maximum of two pre-requisite courses may be repeated ONE TIME to attain the C.
- 7. Prior to completing the nursing application, you must pass the HESI A2 Exam with a score of 75 or higher in reading comprehension, vocabulary and general knowledge, grammar, math, biology, and anatomy & physiology. The personality style and learning style areas must also be taken. - 8. Admission is competitive and based on previous academic performance. First priority will be given to those applicants who have not had to repeat any previous academic course work.
- All applications and supporting documents must be submitted to the School of Nursing by March 1 for fall and spring entry into the Nursing Program.
- 10. The school of Nursing has the right to deny admission to students who have been expelled, suspended, dismissed, or denied re-admission to another program.
- 11. Students are required to show evidence of current American Heart Association C.P.R. certification (Basic Cardiovascular Life Support for the Healthcare Provider) prior to enrollment and maintain an active status throughout enrollment in the nursing course. A student without evidence of current, appropriate certification will not be admitted to the clinical area.
- 12. Students must complete the Nursing Program within five years of their initial enrollment.
- 13. The School of Nursing reserves the right to make changes in policy and program without notice.

Graduation

All nursing majors will meet the Langston University requirements for graduation (see Langston University Catalog). A total of 124 semester credit hours are required for the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. The last 30 hours completed for the degree must be taken in residence at Langston University (main campus or Tulsa campus).

The following additional requirements may be of special importance to transfer students:

- 1. A minimum of 60 semester hours of credit <u>must</u> be earned at an accredited senior institution.
- 2. A maximum of 64 hours of credit applicable to a degree may be earned at a junior college.
- 3. A minimum of 45 semester hours of credit <u>must</u> be earned in senior college level (courses numbered 3000 & 4000).
- 4. A minimum of 32 weeks in residence at Langston University (Main Campus or Tulsa).
