Pre-Occupational Therapy Program for OUHSC

The Pre-Occupational Therapy program is designed to meet the requirements of the Master of Occupational Therapy at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. The applicant must have completed a minimum of 90 hours with a minimum GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale and a minimum C grade in each required course.

Additional Information

Program Description

The Master of Occupational Therapy professional program consists of 80 semester hours of sequenced and integrated didactic and clinical courses including 26 weeks of fieldwork to be completed in no more than 5 years. All didactic course work is offered on the OUHSC campuses in Oklahoma City and Tulsa. This program begins in the summer of every year.

Application Requirements

Admission to the program requires completion of pre-requisite course work and submission of all application materials. The Department Admissions Committee will review application materials and will request additional information such as a personal interview. To be considered for admission to the Occupational Therapy Program an applicant must:

- 1. Have earned a Bachelor degree from an accredited college or university <u>or</u> have completed requirements (minimum 90 hours) to be eligible to earn Bachelor of Science in Health Studies degree after completion of 30 hours in the program
- 2. Be in good standing with the college or university last or currently attending
- Have a minimum cumulative and science grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale for all college work and life science courses attempted
- 4. Have completed all department pre-requisite courses with grades of C or better
- 5. Document 40 hours of observation experience in a variety of occupational therapy settings prior to application
- 6. Submit Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores: General Test (1000-1100 competitive)
- 7. Students for whom English is a second language must submit a minimum score of 600 (paper), 250 (computer) or 100 (internet) within two years prior to application on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).

Application Procedure

- 1. Submit a completed online application from: http://www.ah.ouhsc.edu/main/application/default.asp
- 2. Submit the following by February 1, of the year in which admission is sought:
 - · A completed University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center application
 - Official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended
 - · Documentation of observation experience (40 hours)
 - · GRE Scores
 - · Non-refundable application fees
- 3. A letter of acceptance, alternate status, or denial to the Occupational Therapy program will be mailed the latter part of April. If notification is not received by May 1, contact the department.
- 4. The applicant must accept the position in writing within two weeks of notification and confirm their intention to enroll and attend with a \$100 non-refundable deposit. The deposit is applied toward tuition and fees during the first term or the position will be considered declined. Alternates will be selected according to ranking. Alternates may be admitted up to the first class day for the summer semester if not all positions have been filled.
