

Eligibility Criteria:

To be eligible to receive the 2020-2021 Tsa La Gi Trail of Tears Award, the student must:

- Be classified as a full-time college or university undergraduate at Northeastern State University
- Have proof of Cherokee tribal membership
- Incoming freshmen must have a GPA of 3.0, or ACT score of 21, or upper 10% of class
- Transfer or continuing college students must have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0

New applicants must submit:

- A one-page typed personal statement
- A copy of your Cherokee Nation Blue Card (photocopy of both front and back) and/or verification of your tribal citizenship with Cherokee Nation
- Official current transcript
- Two letters of recommendation (submit with application).
- Completed application form
- Trail of Tears Cover Page (attach to front of application materials)

Previously awarded applicants submit (must have received the award the previous semester):

- A one-page typed personal statement
- Official current transcript
- Completed application form

This scholarship, which ranges from \$500-\$1400 per academic year, is disbursed each semester.
