Northeastern State University

This scholarship program has been designed to assist in funding undergraduate American Indian students' education at Northeastern State University. Those students eligible for the program will receive a tuition waiver scholarship for 100% of their non-resident tuition.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Non-resident of the state of Oklahoma
2. Must meet regular admission requirements as an incoming freshmen or transfer student
3. Must be enrolled full-time (at least 12 hours) at NSU
4. Must possess a tribal citizenship card from a federally recognized tribe
