## TRANSFER ADMISSION STANDARDS

An undergraduate transfer student has more than six attempted credit hours, excluding remedial (zero-level) or pre-college work and excluding credit hours through concurrent coursework in high school. Students must meet the following requirements:

7 - 23 credit hours, 1.7 GPA, & satisfy all freshmen admission requirements

OR

24 - 30 credit hours, 1.7 GPA (cumulative)

OR

31+ credit hours & 2.0 GPA (cumulative)

Transfer students who do not meet the above requirements will be reviewed holistically and may be admitted on probation.


# TRANSFER STUDENT CHECKLIST

While admissions requirements vary for different types of students, the basics are the same for everyone.

- Complete an application online at apply.nsuok.edu. Pay the \$25 non-refundable application fee.
- Provide official transcripts from each college you previously attended. In-progress transcripts are accepted.
- If you have 23 or fewer hours of college credit, you must also submit an official high school transcript and your ACT/SAT scores.
- Students who graduated from a high school outside of the United States, and have not received an Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree from a U.S. regionally accredited institution, will also need to submit their TOEFL scores.

# REVERSE TRANSFER

You might already have the credits for a two-year degree.

NSU and SmartChoice partner institutions have collaborated to develop

a means for maximizing your prior work at your two-year institution. This agreement allows students to transfer the credits they obtain from NSU back to the community college they previously attended in order to complete the requirements for an associate degree. This process is referred to as a Reverse Transfer.

### **Quad State Scholarship**

Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri and Texas residents may be eligible for non-resident tuition waivers.
