Abstract Instructions

The Twelfth annual NSU Undergraduate Research Day: A Celebration of Scholarly and Creative Activity will be held in the University Center Ballroom from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., **Wednesday, April 23, 2014**. All students who would like to be considered for participation in Undergraduate Research Day must submit an electronic copy of the ABSTRACT of their project using the format detailed below.

- 1. Single space throughout. Use 12-point font (do not worry about which font to use, it will be re-formatted when the Program is prepared).
- 2. Title is centered, in bold, in upper and lower case letters with large/important words capitalized (see EXAMPLE below).
- 3. Skip a line
- 4. Student Author(s) name(s) is/are centered. Not bold
- 5. Without skipping a line: Type "Faculty Advisor:" then list the name(s) of the Faculty Advisors. This should be centered, not bold.
- 6. Skip a line
- 7. Enter the Abstract. Indent the first line but not succeeding lines. Ideally the entire Abstract should be in a single paragraph, but if multiple paragraphs are used, indent the first line of each paragraph. Please limit the Abstract to 600 words.
