Graduate Students Financial Aid - Post Award

Financial Aid Facts

- » The Office of Student Financial Services corresponds with all NSU students via their NSU email; check it regularly so you don't miss important requirements, reminders, deadlines, and updates.
- Students must be enrolled in at least half-time status to be eligible for Direct Student Loans. Half-time status for graduate students is 5 to 8 graduate level hours.
- Students who plan on enrolling in any summer courses may want to reduce their prior Fall/Spring accepted loan amounts to ensure that they will have loan availability during the summer term.
- Students who completely withdraw or drop an individual class during the first two weeks of Fall or Spring semesters, or the first week of Summer, are eligible for a full refund of tuition and fees.
- » All aid offers are initially based on full-time enrollment. Aid will be adjusted to actual enrollment before disbursement.

Instructions to View and Accept Awards:

- >> Go to www.nsuok.edu
- » Click on the goNSU link in the top, right corner
- » Sign in with your NSU username and password
- » Click on the 'Student' tab
- » Click the 'financial aid awards' link
- » Select aid year and submit
- You must accept the terms and conditions before you can view and accept the awards. You will have to click on the 'Terms and Conditions' tab.
- Once Terms and Conditions are accepted, click on the 'accept aid offered' tab to view and accept/decline amounts.
- » Once awards are accepted or declined, proceed to the 'Resources & Additional Info' tab. Your authorization is needed in order for federal student aid funds to be allowed to pay for non-institutional charges such as books, parking tickets, etc.
- In the middle of the page, there is a drop-down box you must choose 'Yes' or 'No,' scroll to bottom, and click submit.

Entrance Counseling:

This process could take 15-30 minutes

- » Go to www.studentaid.gov
- >> Under the 'Complete Aid Process,' select 'Complete Entrance Counseling'
- Scroll down and click 'Log in to Start' and use your FSA ID and password to login
- Select the state your school is in (Oklahoma), and select the school's name (Northeastern State University)
- Click 'Notify this school'
- Select student type 'I am completing entrance counseling to receive direct loans as a graduate or professional student.' Then select 'continue'
- Complete the counseling questions and submit.
 - >> This will be electronically submitted to NSU
 - You do not need to submit a copy or sign anything with the University

Master Promissory Note (MPN):

- » Go to www.studentaid.gov
- Dogin with your FSA ID and password
- » Under the 'Complete Aid Process,' select 'Complete a Master Promissory Note'
- Complete and submit
 - This will be electronically submitted to NSU
 - You do not need to submit a copy or sign anything with the University

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP):

To maintain Financial Aid eligibility, students must make Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) toward degree completion. To meet SAP requirements:

- » Pass at least 67% of courses attempted
- » Maintain a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Enroll in at least five hours per semester
- Federal funding is available for up to 150% of your degree program. For example, if your degree program requires 36 credit hours, funding may be available for up to 54 credit hours.

^{**}If these requirements are not met, graduate students could end up on Financial Aid suspension.
