

Course Sequence Worksheet

The Social Work major consists of 46 hours of required social work courses, 6 hours of social work electives, and 5 hours of upper division electives from social work, social science, psychology, or Native American Studies. This is a total of 57 hours. To graduate, 124 hours are required, and a minimum of 60 of these hours must be from a four year school. Therefore, only 64 hours of transfer credits will be counted toward the undergraduate degree.

On the Tahlequah/Broken Arrow campus, junior year courses are offered on Tuesday and Thursday, and senior year courses are offered on Monday and Wednesday. First semester courses are offered only in the fall, and second semester courses are offered only in the spring (*except Case Management & Social Policy).

(Note: The essay will be reviewed for both content and writing style. The essay should be a minimum of 1000 words.)

PRACTICUM: What are your goals for the BSW practicum placement? Do you have a specific population of interest?

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NORTHEASTERN STATE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK STUDENT CONTRACT

As a social work student in Northeastern State University's Social Work Program, I will uphold and abide by the program and university policies and the NASW Code of Ethics.

I understand the justifications for terminating a student's enrollment in the program, which include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. **Poor Academic Performance.** If course grades or GPA requirements are not met, or if a student fails to demonstrate that grade deficiencies can be corrected within a reasonable time, or if a student participates in academic misconduct, a recommendation to terminate enrollment may be made. See the criteria below:
 - BSW: The student will maintain a C grade or above in all social work courses.
- 2. <u>Chronic Absenteeism.</u> The Department of Social Work holds a consistent attendance policy across *both* programs at all locations for 16-week courses. A student is permitted:
 - 2 absences before the grade is affected;
 - 3rd absence there will be an overall letter-grade deduction;
 - 4th absence the student is encouraged to withdraw or will receive a 2nd overall letter grade deduction;
 - 5th absence the student will be unable to pass the course.
- 3. <u>Unprofessional Behavior</u>. Behavior that violates either the National Association of Social Workers Code of Ethics and/or the NSU University Code of Student Conduct (found in the NSU Student Manual) is a legitimate basis for termination from the program.

4. <u>Persistent Ineffectiveness in the Practicum Setting.</u> When the student is repeatedly unable to develop or demonstrate minimum levels of effective performance and gives no evidence of accomplishing the learning outcomes outlined in the student's education contract, evaluation, or syllabus, it constitutes a legitimate basis for termination. This includes violating agency policies.

Read and sign upon agreement: I have read and understand the Social Work Student Contract and will follow the terms listed above. I will demonstrate integrity as a novel social work student and seek guidance when needed. I understand I will be terminated from the program for violating the items listed above.
