

Pre-Occupational Therapy

It should be emphasized that “Pre-Occupational Therapy” is NOT a major. It simply means that the student is meeting requirements for transferring. Academic requirements for transferring vary by institution. To be eligible for transferring, you are advised to complete the following courses.

***NSU-OT and OU-OT will accept HCA 2211 but it does not count towards the minor in Pre-Health

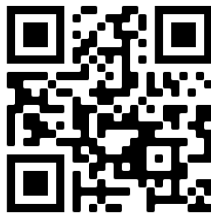

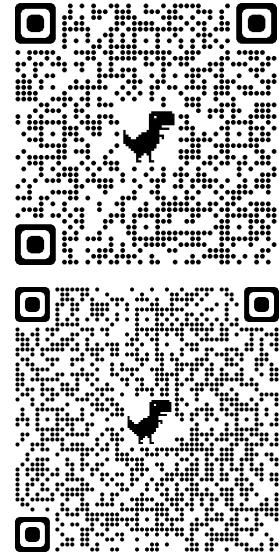

Additional Comments

- NSU has a spring start date and OU has a summer start date
- Students may need to take additional or different classes if applying to schools outside of Oklahoma
- Student should double check the application deadlines and start dates for the programs as these vary
- For support during application student should contact the Pre-Health Advisor
- Students need to have earned a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university by the time they begin the OT program at either institution
- Have a minimum cumulative and science grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale for all college work and life science courses attempted
- Have completed all department pre-requisite courses with grades of C or better
- **Document 40 hours of observation experience in a variety of occupational therapy settings prior to application**
- Submit Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores.
