What is Academic Forgiveness?

Academic Forgiveness is a way for students to recover from academic problems without forever jeopardizing academic standing. In accordance with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education policy (3.12.6 Grading - Academic Forgiveness Provisions), NSU has adopted a three-part Academic Forgiveness Policy for currently enrolled undergraduate students; Repeated Courses, Academic Reprieve, Academic Renewal

How to calculate your GPA: (grades * credits)/ credits = GPA

Step One: Calculate how many credit hours you have of each letter grade

Number of Credit Hours	Grade	Total Grade Points (Hours x Grade Points)
7	A (4 points)	28
12	B (3 points)	36
21	C (2 points)	42
6	D (1 point)	6
3	F (0 points)	0
Total: 49		Total: 112

Step 2: Divide total grade points by total number of hours

112 grade points/49 credit hours = 2.286 GPA

How to calculate with Academic Forgiveness?

Adjust grade points to reflect new or projected grades. If the student in the example above retook one of the classes they originally received a D, and earned a B, they would adjust those columns accordingly. The number of credit hours earned for a D would drop from 6 to 3 which would adjust grade points for D from 6 to 3. The number of credit hours for B would raise from 12 to 15 which would adjust grade points for B from 36 to 45.

118 grade points to/49 credit hours = 2.408 GPA
